Parents and Guardians,

On Thursday, April 2, 2020, Governor Holcomb and Superintendent of Public Instruction Dr. Jennifer McCormick announced the closing of school buildings for the rest of the 2019-2020 school year. The Governor and Superintendent stated that all K-12 schools will deliver remote instruction for the remainder of the school year in order to complete 160 instructional days. For Clinton Prairie School Corporation, we began using eLearning days immediately once our building was closed. We will continue to conduct eLearning days three days per week (Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays) during the month of April and the first two weeks of May. This will meet our 160 day requirement.

May 14, 2020 will be the last day for students at Clinton Prairie School Corporation for the 2019-2020 school year. May will look exactly like April in regards to eLearning on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays. May 4th, 8th, and the 11th will be waiver days.

With this announcement, I know there are many questions ranging from grading, homework drop-off, items in desks, etc. We are working on a FAQ document that will be located on our website that will be updated as needed. Please understand that this is a fluid time in our educational world, and we are working hard to get all of the answers that you may need regarding your student. Thank you for your patience.

Finally, it is important for our students to stay engaged in the learning process, engaged with their teachers, and complete their work. We only have 18 instructional days left in this school year. Please reach out to your teachers or administrators if you have any questions.
